DC'S CAPITOL STEPS ARE COMING TO ARLINGTON... AT YORKTOWN HS

It's no joke! The Capitol Steps of Washington, DC are coming to Arlington's Yorktown High School for a fun-filled benefit performance on Sunday, May 13th from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The Capitol Steps sharp-witted musical and political satire spans the ideological spectrum. And they're equal-opportunity offenders, scanning the headlines daily and updating their material weekly to provide audiences with ever-changing, up-to-the-minute belly laughs.

Most cast members have worked on Capitol Hill — some for Democrats, some for Republicans — and some for politicians who firmly straddle the fence. But, no matter who holds office, there's never a shortage of new material. Notes founding member Elaina Newport, "Typically the Republicans goof up, and the Democrats party. Then the Democrats goof up and the Republicans party. That's what we call the two-party system!"

The Capitol Steps began as a group of Senate staffers who set out to satirize the very people and places that employed them. In the years that followed, some of the Steps ignored the conventional wisdom ("*Don't quit your day job!*") and became full-time members of the troupe. Taken together, though, the performers have worked in a total of 18 Congressional offices and represent 62 years of collective House and Senate staff experience.




Spring Plant-A-Tree Project

The Arlington County Department of Parks and Recreation and Cultural Resources offered 1,000 free trees to be distributed among the county's civic associations and other community groups for Neighborhood Day (May 12, 2007). Mary Ashton volunteered as the contact person for WCA. Thanks to her hard work, we are receiving 21 new trees for our community. If you requested trees, Mary will be notifying you when and where you can pick up your new tree.

If you missed out on this terrific opportunity, there may be a couple of additional trees available for raffle at the Pancake Breakfast. The County made two types of trees available: Black gum: a medium to large shade tree, with outstanding fall color and a graceful canopy, full grown height – 60 feet, and width – 20 feet; and American fringe tree: a small flowering tree said to rival the more common dogwood, full grown height – 12-20 feet, width - 12-20 feet.

Trees add to the beauty and friendliness of our neighborhoods. They not only enrich the scenic environment, they do much to improve the quality of the air, their shade helps cool our homes, and they provide a much needed environment for our feathered & furry friends.
